

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY.

- 1 This event will be conducted under the ACDS/ FEI rules for driving events as at January 2010 and additional regulations included in this schedule.
- 2 Grading of classes is taken at the closing date of entries.
- 3 Drivers must be members of a club affiliated with the ACDS and must produce a current Membership Card if requested.
- 4 All competitors and their navigators/grooms compete at their own risk and accept any liability for any accident, theft, illness or damage to horses, drivers, grooms, or any person whatsoever.
- 5 In respect to any insurance claim that may arise from my participation in this event I agree to pay the excess fee applying at the date of this event.
- 6 Appeals together with \$50.00 are to be lodged within 30 minutes of the scores being posted for each phase. Money will be refunded unless, in the opinion of the Appeal Committee, the appeal is found to be frivolous.
- 7 The organisers have the right to :- alter any advertised times, refuse any entry with or without stating the reason, measure any horse or pony, reallocate a competitor to the appropriate class.
- 8 Entry fee must accompany entry.
- 9 A timed draw for the three competitions will be provided. Any competitor late for their scheduled starting time may be awarded penalties. In the event of an accident or any other delaying circumstances beyond the control of the competitor, the competitor should contact the Event Secretary and an alternative time may be arranged.
- 10 Each competitor is to present themselves to the marathon starting steward 15 minutes prior to their Marathon start time.
- 11 Dogs must be restrained and should be on a leash at all times.
- 12 All junior drivers must be accompanied by an able and responsible adult groom.

INDEMNITY: Neither the ACDS or the Riverina Carriage Driving Society, nor their appointed officials accept any liability for any accident, theft or illness to horses, drivers, grooms or any person or property whatsoever.
