He is presently training teams for Combined Driving from several European countries at his family's large Equestrian Centre in Delft, The Netherlands.

As well as the above, and the other clinics and activities the Southern Highlands Club will be offering its members throughout the year, there will be its five day Festival of Driving from October 1-5 2015. This is the Club's contribution to the Bundanoon Community for the Sesquicentenary celebrations, and promises to bring many visitors and competitors from interstate and perhaps New Zealand. Formal Dinner – always an event eagerly prepared for by the Enduro participants.

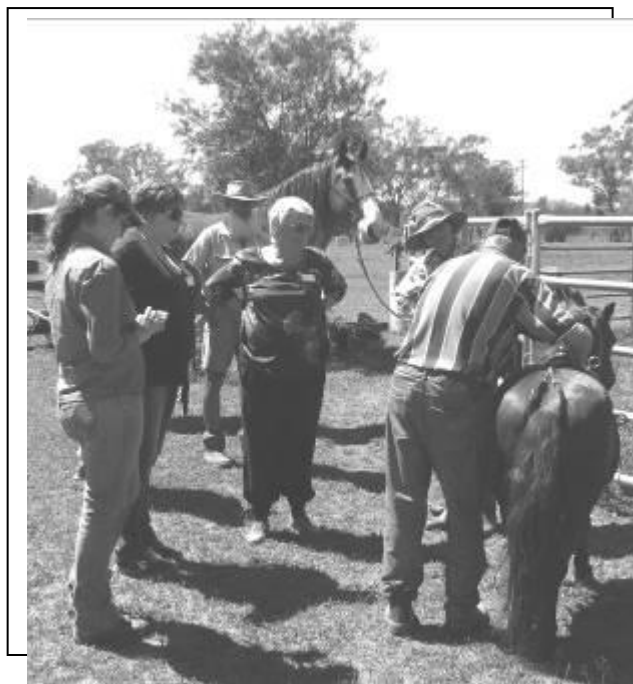

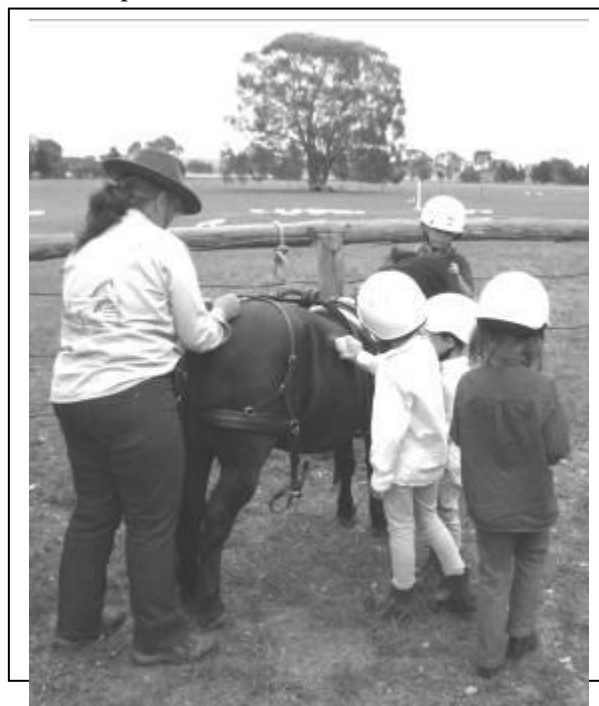

The course was set up in the arena, and it was a great course, except we went left instead of right not only once but twice!

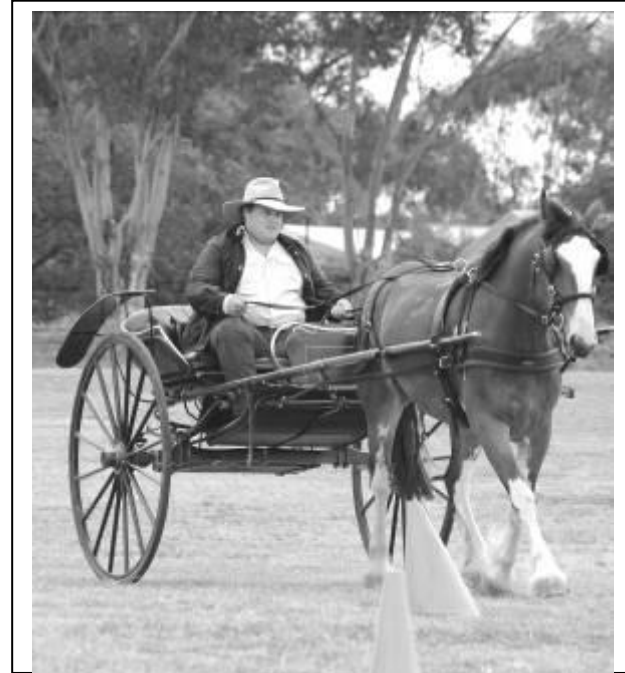

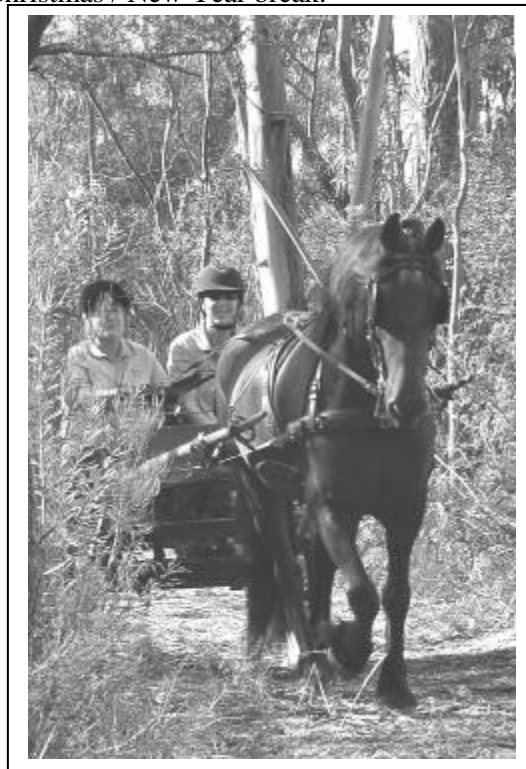
