Basically it is a fun day out with your pony or horse - something we've all been missing!

Oz Trec was introduced in Australia by the Geelong & District Carriage Drivers Club. It started in the 1970s in France as a ridden activity and some years later the British Driving Society incorporated the principle of ridden Trec into a driven activity and Driven Trec began. It is now enjoyed in many countries around the world including the UK, Canada and the USA.

Oz Trec tests horse-and-driver combinations through a range of challenges, rather than focusing on one style or discipline. Safety is a huge priority. It is suitable for all breeds and sizes of horses/ponies along with all types of carriages and all levels of drivers.

Just think a bit of pleasure driving, showing, CDE, dressage and handy mount all thrown into one. Points are gained or lost depending on the phase of the competition with the highest total score determining the winner of each section.

There is no cantering on any part of the course and the activities section are untimed. If you want to skip something that's totally fine.

And most importantly – you can't be eliminated!
