





# GOULBURN DISTRICT HORSE DRAWN VEHICLE SOCIETY



### THE REINSMAN

This issue I will take us back to 1876. In November the iron steam schooner "Georgette' bound for Adelaide from Fremantle was dashed on rocks during a raging storm off the SA coast. The pumps were failing and a lifeboat was lowered but it too smashed on the rocks.

Watching from a cliff above whilst all this was happening was Sam, an aboriginal stockman. He then turned and rode desperately about 12 miles to the Bussell family homestead to raise the alarm. Mrs Bussell prepared the homestead whilst 16 year old daughter Grace (what a beautiful name) and Sam raced back to the scene.

At the site were women, men and children in the water. Down the cliff face rode Grace in a ride equal to the 'Man from Snowy River'. She rode across the rocks and coaxed her horse through the breakers to the people. This she did several times, returning with two or three survivors at a time, clutching the saddle and stirrups. Over the time, Grace and Sam rescued all the remaining survivors in the water – about twenty persons.

Grace then left Sam in charge and rode back and forth bringing food and blankets.

Grace received the Royal Humane Society silver medal in 1878. Sam Isaacs was awarded the bronze medal. The Board of Trade in its wisdom handed out a gold watch. Even the state government stumped up 100 pounds for feeding, housing and clothing the survivors.

What a pair and what a horse!

# VALE: LANCE THOMAS 1938 – 2014 A GENEROUS AND DEDICATED LIFE MEMBER by Tony James

Many ACDS members across Australia were saddened to learn that after a determined and at times hopeful fight against cancer, Lance Thomas passed away during the night on January 28 2014. Lance was a much loved, highly respected and valued member of the Australian Carriage Driving Society. His contribution to the sport of carriage driving in Australia as well as to the ACDS itself was immeasurable and was duly recognized in July 2012, when he and his wife Barbara were awarded Life Memberships. Due to Lance's illness, they were unable to attend the Federal Conference to receive their awards. The ACDS sent then Past President Trevor Brand to Western Australia to present the awards to them both. Lance was noticeably moved by this gesture. Trevor was Federal President and Vice President during a

number of years that Lance was on Federal Council.

Although Lance and Barbara have been prime movers of carriage driving in Western Australia, they also travelled to the south eastern states on five or six occasions to compete with their pony team and/or pair in Australian CDE Championships and other events along the way. In addition, they occasionally travelled east to officiate at major events. That the ACDS is blooming in WA is largely due to the uncompromising dedication to excellence and energy they have injected over many years. The building and maintenance of a championship marathon course and arenas on their property has been a major growth contributor, providing a valuable facility for the society and its members to develop their knowledge and skills. Some may say Lance and Barbara set the bar too high, but others will point to the current high standards of driving, presentation and event organization in WA that was built on the setting of lofty goals.
