





MY HORSE BOKKIE by Echah Wright (North Coast Club)

Bokkie began life here on the farm in northern NSW. His dam was a Percheron TB cross (Mariah) who had done rather well on the show circuit. I bought her from a lady at Bringelly, along with a gelding who has done well at Coffs Harbour Show since. Bok was an accident, but a very nice one.

A brumby stallion arrived in the paddock, because my youngest son felt sorry for him and opened the gate. He was as wild as the hills from which he had come. No one could catch him. He has a story all of his own. We named him Do Chi (Thunder). Do Chi, all 13 hands of pinto, was, I considered, no threat to my mare, and I was in the process of finding her a stallion, so I could breed a beautiful horse for driving. It took a couple of weeks to tame Do Chi in a way of which I approved. He became friendly and unafraid. Then I had to leave them on the farm and go back to work.

We moved back to Sydney after the Christmas holidays and I left the gelding, mare and pony stallion, now a lot tamer and approachable, with friends. I organized a vet to come and geld Do Chi. The deed was done without complications. He was always a kind and gentle soul. In the meantime I could not find a stallion I liked, with the temperament to go with the conformation. So I waited. Unbeknown to me, Do Chi had managed to service the mare, and on January 1 1996, Bok was born. I awoke with my father in law saying "Have you bought another damn horse?" We all

went out to see what he was talking about. There in the paddock next to Mariah was this little black and white goat like creature.

Bok got his name from Spring Bok, jumping goat. Bok is the word for goat in Dutch. He looked like a goat, all hairy and with big ears. I thought 'What have we here?' Due to his colour, I knew who was the sire.

Bok was initiated to the saddle later, rather than as a youngster, at about four years of age, as he was still growing and so immature. He was consequently not ridden much until he was about six years old. He looked very gangly, and was still black and white. He was used mainly for trail riding in his early years, and was a very brave horse. He has been to pony club and he was a very good A grade jumper, used by children at pony club. He has a very strong presence and for the uninitiated, can be a bit daunting.



Bok in a pair driven by Gary Rollans I do not ride any longer, so I asked Gary Rollans to put Bok in harness. So it was that this year his training began at the tender age of 16. Initially Gary said he was too 'naughty' for me, and Gary and I would go out together, and Gary would use him for a while. Now, I take him out at least twice a week, and he has calmed down a treat. He has been in one show and did well, much to my surprise. We only went in for a giggle, but it was a lot of work for a giggle. He has done one novice dressage test and won that as well. There were four other novice competitors. He does look good in harness and he seems to enjoy it more than being ridden. He is a big boy and I have had him all his life. I love him very much, and as my new groom Thea said the other day 'He *really* likes you and he talks to you all the time'.

To make sure I can look after my horses to the best of my ability I did a TAFE Horse Industries Course. It has been very useful, although one never stops learning. The main thing for me is to have fun, be safe, and go out with friends and share my love of horses and driving with others. Bok just wants to eat grass, but he is happy to go out and enjoy a good working trot down a forest path.

CAMP by Sharon Beattie

Details: As one of the NSW Branch's two Young Driver Co-Ordinators I am organizing a 9 day camp in 2013, from January 19 - 27, at Cedar Farm, Cedar Rd Temora in Southern NSW. Other Business

*Dressage tests for multiples for 2012 NSW CDE Champs confirmed as FEI 8A, 8B & 8C

*Treasurer – no nominations for position received at AGM or subsequently. Moved that Branch continue to coopt Tina Kelly to the role of Financial Officer until the next AGM.

*Property Identification Code (PIC) required for Horse Owners as from Sept 1. Check with LHPA.

*Insurance – Clubs need to keep a register of volunteers (Federal will develop template soon). Details of any members, grooms, passengers, or volunteers aged 80yrs + need to be sent to Fed Assistant Sec Sue Waters.

*Memberships must be paid to club by August 31. Cannot drive at ACDS activities and will not be covered by insurance after that date unless membership has been renewed and paid up.
*Fed Council has opportunity to secure 24/7 Personal Accident insurance for members. Would add approx \$4 to Single, and \$8 to Family memberships. Clubs asked to discuss whether ACDS should obtain this cover, and report back to president prior to next meeting.

*Tail restraint – acceptable for use and does not constitute a 'tail tie'

*Annual dressage award is judged on performance and contribution. Clubs, panels and individuals are able to nominate anyone they believe worthy.

*Margaret O'Brien to be accredited as an Advanced Dressage Judge.

*Whip Around to be published in early June rather than after AGM in July due to production difficulties.

*New website has been launched with same web address

*State Logo – competition to be held for members to design a NSW ACDS logo. 2x day passes to Sydney Royal as prize.

*Grants: Southern Highlands Club for NSW Dressage Champs - \$400, Bungendore Club for NSW CDE Champs \$600, Tamworth Club for Judges Development Schools (Dressage, CDE) in Dec 2012 - \$400

*ACDS/NZCDS Cultural Exchange – scheduled for February 2013. Expressions of interest being sought from drivers interested in going to NZ to compete. Contact Tony James for details.

*Young and Beginner Drivers Camp late January 2013 at Temora to be organized as a State Branch activity by Sharon Beattie.

*Job descriptions for NSW Branch positions — written job descriptions for panel members / convenors and executive positions may assist in encouraging people to take on jobs and avoid people going on panels when not aware of the requirements. Panels to come up with position descriptions for panel member / convenor roles. Exec positions to be developed by president. Drafts for next meeting.


*Event clashes – important to check calendar, including major interstate events, before setting dates.


