LIVERPOOL RANGE HARNESS CLUB SPRING DRIVE

Information and Requirements regarding this year's drive:

The participants can arrive on Friday 8th of September 2023 with the pleasure drive commencing on Sunday 10th September 2023 and continuing until Friday 15th which will be the last driving day then everyone can go home on the Saturday 16th of September.

- All participants are to cater for themselves throughout their stay / drive.
- Facilities: Power, toilets and showers, shed to get out of the weather. Town water, lighting community fire pit / drums to sit around at night.
- You can Sight see at Tamworth if you like 50klm away.
- Manilla has an IGA, Coffee Shops, RSL Club, Bowling Club and Pubs short walking distance up the road, good meals available.
- Fuel.
- BYO Horse feed including hay ENOUGH FOR THE YOUR STAY. Also, Salts / Electrolytes RECOMMENDED. Manilla does have a feed store but you must organize yourself.
- All horses need to have had a REASONABLE amount of work before the drive. Daily drives 20 – 40klms per day.
- We suggest each horse commence the drive with a new set of shoes. A spare set recommended. Most of the drive is on dirt roads, tar and or gravel roads.
- A toilet will be towed by the rear escort vehicle during the drive. Water will be carried on an escort vehicle for the horses.
- BYO your own portable yards or electric fence yards.
- There will be a Daily Meeting Debrief every afternoon to talk on next day's drive and any risks.
- Safety Officer / Committee will check vehicles and harness for worthiness pre daily drive.
- All horse drawn vehicles MUST always stay between the escort vehicles. Escort vehicles will be stationed front and rear of the drive.
- UHF Radios to be carried if you have one to keep in contact with escorts
- All Drivers are to **DRIVE AS PER DRIVING A CAR AND FOLLOW THE ROAD RULES. YOU MUST BE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR OWN ACTIONS. NO ALCOHOL WHILST DRIVING: ZERO TOLERANCE**
- Fluro vests must be worn at all times while driving a horse drawn vehicle. Under 18 years must wear a safety helmet when riding in a horse drawn vehicle (ACDS Regulation).
- A sausage sizzle will be run sometime during the drive.

DOGS:

- Any dogs brought along must be confined to the owner's Truck / Float. **Dogs must remain on the lead at all times.** Dogs are not permitted to wander the camping areas this is for the Safety of Humans and Horses. The owner of the dog will be responsible for promptly picking up and disposing of any mess or waste from the dog. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.
